The 2016 B-rrry Scurry 4 mile run/walk race is being held on Saturday, February 6th, 2016. The race course will be closed to all vehicular traffic from **12 noon to 1:30 P.M.**

Exceptions to this closure will be made for persons living along the race route or persons having a specific need to drive to one of these residences on the race course. Those persons will be allowed to cautiously exit and enter the course. All other traffic will be directed away from the race course.

Vehicles traveling on all north-south streets between South 5th St. and Argyle Court can expect extended delays when attempting to cross 5th Ave. So.

The race route will be as follows:

Start: Lincoln Blvd. in front of Clinton Community College

North east on Lincoln Blvd. to 8th A.S. & S 10th St.

East on 8th Ave. So. to S 9th St.

North on So. 9th St to 5th Ave. So.

East on 5th Ave. So to So. 5th St.

North on So 5th St to 3rd Ave. So

West on 3rd Ave. So to So 7th St.

South on So 7th St to 4th Ave. So

East on 4th Ave So into the 500 blk 4th Ave. So

At the designated point, the runners/walkers will turn and retrace the route back to the finish line on Lincoln Blvd. in front of Clinton Community College.

There may be extended delays in the traffic flow for those persons trying to cross 5th Ave. So. from So 5th St. to Argyle Court during the race. Participants in the B-rrry Scurry will have preference to motor vehicle traffic. Officers will be located at major intersections. However, they may not be able to expeditiously allow vehicles to cross 5th Ave. So. **Extended delays can be expected between 11:45 A.M. to 1:30 P.M.**

The Clinton Police Department strongly recommends the motoring public take advantage of Bluff Blvd. and other "north/south" streets east of S 5th Street. When traveling west bound, motorists are encouraged to use 2nd Ave. So and avoid those streets between 3rd Ave. So & 6th Ave. So. from So 5th St to Argyle Court. By avoiding these streets, motorists can effectively circumvent the race route and minimize the inconvenience created.
